Baptism FAQ

Will I still go to heaven if I don't get baptized?—Is baptism required for salvation?

People can be assured of salvation only through faith in Jesus Christ. His atoning sacrifice purifies us and makes us acceptable before God. Baptism is an outward expression of an inward submission to God's will. Those who believe should be baptized, but their salvation is not at risk if they should perish before they can be baptized.

Does it have to be by immersion?

Immersion is the only biblical kind of baptism since every baptism recorded in Scripture was by immersion. Since it is an outward expression meant to be symbolic of our union with Christ in His death and resurrection, the way people are baptized matters—one might say what it looks like is the whole point! Immersion is the biblical model and the best visual representation of the heart's reality.

Should we baptize infants?—Who should be baptized?

Baptism is only performed for those who are believers in Christ; this excludes infants. The reasons people baptize infants—cleansing original sin, as a down payment for salvation, as a sign of belonging to the covenant community—are man-made and not Scriptural. Infant baptism is not legitimate baptism.

Who can baptize people?

Based on Matt. 28:19-20, all Christians have the authority and the responsibility to go and make disciples and baptize them!

Can a person be re-baptized?

Re-baptizing only should occur when the individual believes their original baptism to be illegitimate. In other cases, it is not required, and it does not carry any biblical significance if someone is baptized more than once. Those who have turned away from the Lord and recommitted their lives to Him anew need not be baptized again unless they believe their first conversion was not real.

When should someone be baptized?

People should be baptized as soon as they believe! It is the first step of faith in the Christian walk. Baptism is meant to be the proof of their commitment to Christ.
