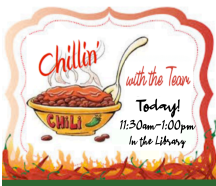

Study Guide

Joshua Chapter I

Sunday, September 20, 2020

Truth Point: We learned that Joshua had big shoes to fill as a leader after Moses died. Sometimes big responsibilities are thrust upon us, even at times of grieving loss. God still promises to be there for us, but there are expectations.

Reflection Points:

1. What is the premise for the promise of success in Joshua 1:8b? It states: “For then you will make your way prosperous, and then you will have success.”
2. What is the premise for the promise for Psalm 1:3? It states: “He is like a tree planted by streams of water that yields its fruit in its season, and its leaf does not wither. In all that he does, he prospers.”
3. What is the premise for the promise in Malachi 3:19? It states: “Put me to the test, says the Lord of hosts, if I will not open the windows of heaven for you and pour down for you a blessing until there is no more need”
4. Now read Romans 8:38-39. Are there any premises to these promises?

Action Points:

1. In what areas are you challenged to be more obedient to God’s Word after understanding the premises?
2. What accountability should you set up to get you to your goal?
